In principle, all lectures and research guidance will be given in English. Graduate students will work in a cooperative educational environment where Japanese and international students jointly develop their analytical skills and ability to carry out their ideas, enabling them to convert their knowledge into practical activities in the three academic domains described below. We expect graduate students who complete the course to play immediate, active roles in contributing to solve a variety of important issues in global society by making excellent use of the abilities acquired during the course.

Key Concept: Accounting/Finance × Data Analytics

- In addition to expertise in business including accounting, finance, and marketing, we will foster graduate students who can combine business and IT with practical data analytical skills utilizing programming languages such as R and XBRL.
