Outline of the job search schedule

- Register for online recruitment information services (e.g., Mynavi, Rikunabi, etc.)

- Participate in internship programs (IS) during summer break or fall/winter semester
IS document screening, interview, etc. Students can participate in the programs from their first year of university.

- Submit inquiries/applications to companies
Write entry sheets (ES) and CVs, and submit them to companies

- Conduct self-analysis and research on industries and companies
- Prepare for written/online exams, have your CVs and other submissions reviewed, and practice for interviews
(Some companies start job interviews [conduct preliminary selection] and give early unofficial job offers)
Note: In recent years, an increasing number of companies are starting selection processes before the official March 1 start of recruitment activities, targeting third year undergraduates and first year students of the Master's Program, while still participating in summer break internship programs.

- Participate in on- and off-campus recruitment seminars
- Take recruitment exams
Written exam, online exam, aptitude exam, interview, group discussion, etc.
- Receive an early unofficial job offer

- Take the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) conducted in July and December

- Receive a preliminary job offer

- Take the BJT Business Japanese Proficiency Test

- Change the status of residence
