Toyo University is a home to 15 graduate schools consisting of 36 courses. In addition to courses taught in Japanese, students can take courses taught in English. In particular, the number of classes taught in English has increased year by year and now there are over 400 graduate classes taught in English.

Toyo University Graduate Schools offers degree programs called English Track Curriculums which are designed for students who wish to complete their course entirely in English.

Course of International Culture and Communication Studies (Master's Program)

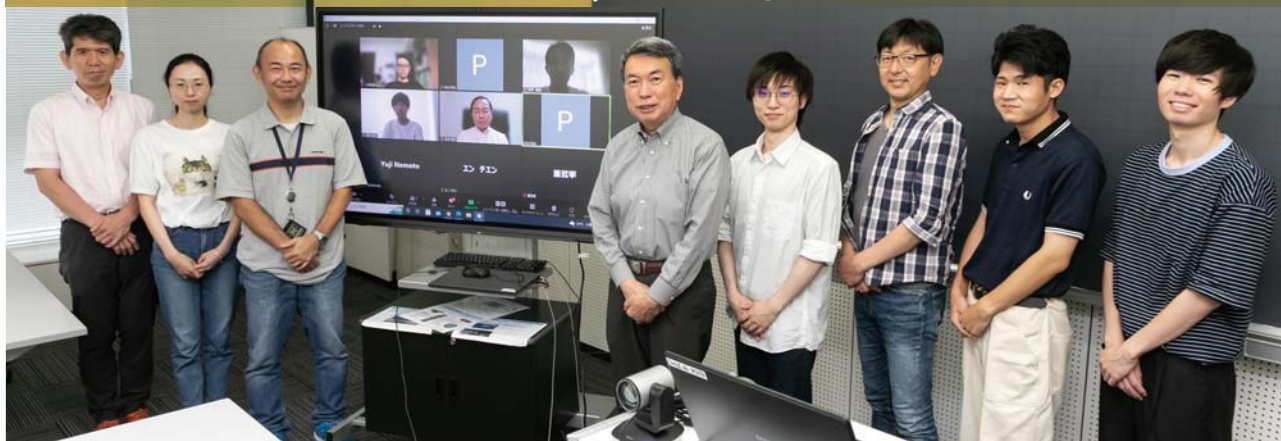


Outline

This course was newly established in the 2019 academic year. Students can engage in multilateral study in two areas: the language communication field, in which students learn English, French, German, and Japanese language education; and the international culture field, in which students study the literature and culture of each language sphere. In addition, students can gain a specialized teacher's certificate for junior and senior high school English. English track subjects, which are completed entirely in English, are also available (Master's Program only). We aim to foster international, highly specialized professionals and sophisticates with practical adaptability, and talented personnel who can play active roles in the fields of specialist education and research relating to language communication and culture in different areas of the world. We are open to international students and to mature students. Currently, students from countries such as China, Brazil, and Nepal are studying this course.

Graduate School of Economics

Course of Public-Private Partnership (Master's Program)



Outline

TOYO PPP School (Course of Public-Private Partnership, Graduate School of Economics) is a graduate school for professionals that focuses on Public-Private Partnership (PPP). Since its opening in 2006, TOYO PPP School has implemented a variety of projects in partnership with local governments in Japan and abroad. Those students include employees from the public sector, private sector enterprises such as construction, real estate and finance, and people who are working in projects overseas. In 2015, Toyo University established a specialist Centre of Excellence on PPPs in Local Governments under the auspices of the UNECE. This was in recognition of the achievements of TOYO PPP School's educational activities, and also of research by the Research Center for Public-Private Partnership and Asia Public-Private Partnership Institute. Thus, Toyo University has now become a knowledge hub that gathers PPP information from around the world and disseminates a rich supply of research results.

Graduate School of Global and Regional Studies

Course of Global Innovation Studies (Master's Program)



Outline

This course will be established at the graduate level to contribute to global society through innovation. We will accomplish this by cultivating the next generation of leaders, filled with an entrepreneurial mindset, who have the practical knowledge necessary for solving global issues, specialized skill sets with practical English communication ability, as well as excellent leadership. In principle, all lectures and research guidance will be given in English. Graduate students will work in a cooperative educational environment where Japanese and international students jointly develop their analytical skills and ability to carry out their ideas, enabling them to convert their knowledge into practical activities in the three academic domains. We expect graduate students who complete the course to play immediate, active roles in contributing to solve a variety of important issues in global society by making excellent use of the abilities acquired during the course.

Graduate School of Global and Regional Studies

Course of Regional Development Studies (Master's & Doctoral Program)



Outline

The Course of Regional Development Studies was established with an aim to foster individuals with highly specialized skills who can contribute to “regional development” in Japan and overseas, as regional development leaders contributing to autonomous and sustainable regional development based on their global perspectives, in a global society faced with various issues and possibilities.

In the Master’s Program, we foster individuals with highly specialized skills who can contribute to “regional development” in Japan and overseas, and in the Doctoral Program, we foster academic specialists/researchers with a good balance of theories and practices who can contribute to “regional development” in Japan and overseas.

Graduate School of International Tourism Management

Course of International Tourism Management (Master's & Doctoral Program)



Outline

This course was established based on the foundation of the Faculty of International Tourism Management to develop tourism professionals who can be the driving force for sustainable global tourism. We will develop talent who can manage tourism from various perspectives.

In the Masters’ Program, our objective is to send graduates into society who can become leaders of innovation in inbound tourism, and who can work as a bridge between Japan and various countries in international tourism development projects. In this course, there are many adult students enrolled, who, with their company experience as a backdrop, have returned to campus and are conducting research. There are also those who, after completing the course, are aiming for new highs in the business world, and others who are mostly pursuing a career as teachers in higher education. There are also international students from diverse countries and regions enrolled in the course.

Graduate School of Information Sciences and Arts



Outline

The Course of Information Sciences and Arts comprises the following three fields essential to the study of information sciences and arts: "System Informatics," "Media Informatics," and "Psychological and Sports Informatics." **【Field of System Informatics】** Aims to cultivate practical specialists with classes on cutting-edge information and communications technology (ICT) and business administrative informatics. **【Field of Media Informatics】** Aims to cultivate practical specialists with classes on cutting-edge ICT and media informatics. **【Field of Psychological and Sports Informatics】** Aims to cultivate practical specialists with classes on cutting-edge ICT and psychological and sports informatics. Note: In this field, the study of psychology will be newly combined with sports sciences.

Graduate School of Life Sciences



Outline

The world is in great danger today. People of the 21st century are responsible for building a sustainable society with low environmental impact. Life sciences play a central role in responding to the needs and solving problems, such as improving and preserving the global environment, securing food, and addressing issues of healthcare and graying society. The Graduate School explores cutting-edge themes across two interrelated disciplines: life science and applied bioscience. We are conducting leading research with a primary focus on plants and animal organisms in the fields of medicine and agriculture as well as extremophilic microorganisms.

Graduate School of Life Sciences

Course of Biomedical Engineering (Master's & Doctoral Program)



Outline

We provide education to train human resources who have acquired basic knowledge in the field of life science as well as advanced applied technology in the field of medical engineering. In other words, we aim to cultivate talented personnel who have a scientific inquisitive mind to respond to the demands of medical technology at the cellular and molecular levels, as well as acquire cutting-edge technologies in the field of biomedical engineering such as nanodevices, nanomaterials, and immunotherapy.

*1. If advancing to a graduate school from an undergraduate faculty of Toyo University (excluding correspondence courses and Toyo University Junior College), the admission fee (admission confirmation fee) will be exempt.

If advancing to a Doctoral Program from a Master's Program of Toyo University, the admission fee (admission confirmation fee) will be exempt.

- The admission fee (admission confirmation fee) is only required in the first academic year.
- Students can choose to pay the entire amount (full payment) or to pay their tuition, facility fee and lab fee in two installments per year (installment payment).
- The admission fee (admission confirmation fee) that has been paid will not be refunded for any reason, as it is a "consideration for obtaining a position that will enable the applicant to enroll in a graduate school and course at Toyo University Graduate Schools for which the applicant was accepted." Submitted documents will not be returned.

- The tuition listed above is the amount prior to the 30% tuition waiver. () is the amount of the tuition after the 30% waiver. New students are required to pay the full amount of tuition. After admission, the waiver amount is refunded after the partial tuition waiver is approved.

Toyo University Graduate School Scholarship

This is Toyo University's original scholarship program which aims to contribute to the cultivation of promising intellectual talent through academic encouragement and financial aid.

◆ Amount of Scholarship: 300,000 yen yearly for Master's Programs / Doctoral Programs

Scholarship

Masajuro Shiokawa Scholarship *Recommendation-Based

This scholarship was created by Toyo University's former Chancellor, Masajuro Shiokawa, for the purpose of contributing to the development of international students' talent and promoting international exchanges in the university. Scholarships will be granted for one year to international students (status of residence: Student) with excellent academic grades.

◆ Amount of Scholarship: 100,000 yen monthly × 12 months
◆ Number of students who qualified : 2 (Graduate Schools)

Partial Tuition Waiver for Privately Financed International Students

This is a scholarship equivalent to 30% of tuition for international students with a status of residence of "Student." To select the students, academic grades are considered.
