研究成果の概要 Summary of your research achievements	<p>This research internship for knowledge exchange between Toyo University and KAI is a part of a Cooperation Agreement between the Universities.</p> <p>The purpose of the internship was cultural and educational diplomacy, exchange of experience, teaching methods, organization of the educational process, and innovative projects at Toyo University; reaching Cooperation Agreements in solving problems of scientific and technical cooperation, ensuring the quality of education, improving the efficiency of educational and research work at universities, and expanding cooperation agreements, which will provide new opportunities for both students and teachers.</p> <p>The internship at Toyo University was important in the context of deepening international cooperation between higher education institutions and promoting academic exchange.</p> <p>Based on the results of the internship, the parties agreed to hold training courses on topical issues such as Space Diplomacy, Cyber Diplomacy, Artificial Intelligence in International Relations, Cyber Terrorism, Cyber Warfare, International Humanitarian Law, International Air Law, and Aviation Accident Investigation. Particular attention was paid to expanding opportunities for academic mobility, in particular short-term academic mobility for students, which will open up new horizons for learning and exchange of experience between</p>

universities. The parties also agreed to intensify publication activities in internationally indexed journals, which will help to enhance the scientific image of both institutions and is an important aspect for the development of scientific research. In particular, based on the results of the internship, it is planned to publish scientific articles related to the problems of the international world order and global security of the Asia-Pacific region.

The meeting with the Rector and Members of the Supervisory Board of Toyo University (President of Toyo University Etsuko Yaguchi, Chancellor Shinji Fukukawa, Vice Presidents: Toshiya Aramaki, Takashi Sawaguchi, Hideaki Tada, Chairman of the Executive Board Takashi Anzai, and member of the Executive Board, Nobuyuki Terada) indicates the intensification of international cooperation between higher education institutions. In particular, we discussed the prospects of cooperation, the possibility of developing new joint projects between KAI and Toyo University in the future, focused on the importance of exchanging experience in research and innovation, as well as the possibilities of student and teacher exchange programs, the implementation of joint master's and doctoral programs with Toyo University, joint research and joint training, summer programs, language courses, conferences and academic programs, training of Japanese cybersecurity specialists, development of interdisciplinary cyber diplomacy programs that integrate technical aspects of cybersecurity with humanitarian components of diplomacy, advanced training of teachers and internship opportunities for graduate students of the State University "Kyiv Aviation Institute" at Toyo University.

It was extremely important to present the Diploma of an Honorary Member of the Scientific Society of Undergraduate and Postgraduate Students to the President of Toyo University, Etsuko Yaguchi.

It is worth noting that the scientific society strives to reveal the leadership and creative abilities of the students of the Faculty of International Relations in the academic sphere to ensure their comprehensive development through involvement in the organization and holding of meetings with representatives of the scientific, expert, diplomatic professional environment; organization of discussions on topical issues of international relations and domestic socio-political development, as well as work in such areas as the preparation of analytical reports and analytical digests. The society organizes various events aimed at promoting this development. These include inviting Ambassadors of different countries, representatives of Ministries and experienced professionals to share their knowledge and ideas. Committed to innovation, cooperation and excellence, the society serves as a platform for students to unlock their potential and make a meaningful contribution to the world of international relations.

The recognition of Etsuko Yaguchi as an honorary member of the Scientific Society of the Faculty of International Relations was the result of her personal contribution to the research activities of the Faculty of International Relations. This recognition underlines the importance of international academic cooperation and opens up new horizons for the students of the Faculty of International Relations.

An important aspect was the holding of an open lecture for students of Toyo University on 'Ukraine and Japan: Sustainable Development in the Context of Global Conflict', which was also attended by members of the University Administration and the Supervisory Board of Toyo University. The lecture covered issues of the international world order and the Russian-Ukrainian war. In particular, it was noted that Russia's military aggression against Ukraine has grossly violated the universally recognized principles of international law and order and sustainable

development, and that this poses a serious threat to security, peace and stability. 'The forcible seizure of territory and attempts to change internationally recognized borders by force are completely unacceptable. Russia must immediately cease hostilities and unconditionally withdraw its forces from the territory of Ukraine.' The lecture also covered Japan's cooperation within the Group of Seven, global food security, information security and counter-propaganda. It was emphasized that Japan strongly condemns Russia's use of information manipulation and disinformation campaigns in the international arena.

The lecture focused on bilateral cooperation between Ukraine and Japan, which is based on the shared values of freedom, democracy, the rule of law, and respect for international law and human rights. Japan reaffirmed its commitment to participate in Ukraine's post-war recovery. The lecture provoked a lively discussion and interest among the students of Toyo University and was an important step in promoting international dialogue and support for Ukraine in the face of aggression, underlining the importance of international cooperation and Japan's readiness to actively participate in the restoration of Ukraine.

Important for me in terms of sharing international experience were the lectures by Vice President for International Relations, Professor Toshiya Aramaki on 'Globalization of Toyo University' and the lecture 'Japanese Higher Education System and Quality Assurance at Toyo University' by Vice President for Academic Affairs, Professor Takashi Sawaguchi. The meeting with the Dean of Law, Faculty of Law Masashi Ota and Professors James D.Short and Steven Green facilitated the exchange of experience in teaching, research and innovation; discussion of research and publication opportunities, participation in internships that will allow students to gain international experience and knowledge; joint research project, conferences and other initiatives.

The working meeting with the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Ukraine to Japan Sergiy Korsunsky was extremely important. The expansion of the Cooperation Agreement with Toyo University, which provides new opportunities for internships not only for students but also for faculty members of the School of International Relations, is a sign of the growing interest in academic cooperation between universities of both countries.
