## What is a Resident Assistant?

#### Overview

Resident Assistant (RA) is a student staff who live in the International House (I-House) with other residents and provide various kinds of support to them and daily operation of the residence. Their main duties include 1) planning, organizing, and operating in-house events, and 2) provide help and support to residents. They communicate with residents and help them find solutions. They also help international students who may need cultural and social support.

#### Qualities and Skills that RAs are expected to possess:

- Positive attitude toward interacting with others and understanding different cultures
- ·Language skills (especially Japanese and/or English)
- ·Enthusiasm toward study abroad or other global activities
- ·Willingness to support operation of the I-House and improve living environments
- •Ability to manage own time and academic matters and be responsible for the RA position

#### Why RA?

You will be able to improve the following skills and abilities through RA activities:

<u>Understanding of different cultures, communication skills, language skills,</u>
flexibility, leadership, and teamwork

## International House

#### Overview

International House opened in 2008 and has mainly accommodated international exchange students and researchers from overseas. The residence is a 15-minute walk from Hakusan campus and located in a quiet housing area. Designed by a non-Japanese architect, the I-House offers more space to each unit and room. From March 2022, it has been available to all degree-seeking students.

## **RA Position**

### Number of positions offered 3

## Start date and term 入居及び活動期間

- Move-in date: September 1, 2023
- •Term : Basically 1 year (Another 1 year may be added based on the mutual agreement between the RA and the University)

## **Housing fees**

- ·Initial moving-in fee: 50,000 JPY (non-refundable)
- Monthly fee: 57,000 JPY (utility and internet fees included)
   (The regular monthly rate is 81,000 JPY. The rate for RAs is reduced to help RA activities)
- •Rental fee of bedding items (2,300 JPY) is additionally charged.

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

## 1 In-house events

·Organize and operate monthly events for residents (4 events per semester)

## **2** Providing general support

- ·Checking safety and sanitary within the residence
- ·Helping residents when moving-in and -out
- Supporting various orientations
- ·Communicating with the dormitory manager and the International Affairs Office
- •Responding to emergency situations (sickness or injury)
- Communicating with residents who do not follow the rules (sharing that information with the dormitory manager and IAO)
- •Supporting international students

  Following up after moving-in, residence registration, opening a bank account, accompanying to clinic, and more.
- •Other kinds of support to realize safe and comfortable residence experience

·RA meetings

Meetings with the dormitory manager and the IAO

Students who meet all of the following requirements:

- ·Being a Toyo's degree-seeking student
- ·Having IELTS 5.5 or equivalent English level
- ·Being able to live in the residence for the whole period of RA
- ·Understanding RA's duties and responsibilities and being able to fulfill them
- Observing the residence rules

## Skills and experience desired

- •Experience of study abroad or interacting with people from various backgrounds
- ·Management experience (in student group, part-time job, or other situations)
