	Program Description & syllabus		<p>The unit involves recorded lectures, in-class and online tutorials, independent readings, joint activities and discussions, and three assessments. In order to comprehend and be able to employ the material from the weekly topics, you will need to engage with all of the learning activities, actively and constructively. This entails careful reading and listening, keen participation, generous debates, and a clear willingness to learn from each other and different sociocultural backgrounds.</p> <p>This unit is organised as a 1-hour pre-recorded lecture (available in Blackboard every Thursday prior to the weekly tutorial) and a 2-hour tutorial every week that will be entirely online. Online students are expected to actively engage in two 1-hr online tutorial activities every week: one on Discussion Forum in Blackboard and the other over Blackboard Collaborate (or Zoom). This is the space where you complete the tutorial activities and discuss various aspects of content covered each week. Both parts allow and encourage you to share insights and ask questions as part of each tutorial.</p> <p>We will find the best times for the weekly online group meeting. This will give you a chance to interact with your instructor (me) and have a group experience in this class. Tutorials from the internal version of the unit will not be recorded, but the 1-hr online meeting will be. Each unit is worth 150 learning hours – tutorial activities are part of this, and they are essential for you to succeed on the three assessments.</p> <p>You must listen to the lecture and complete the preparatory readings and activities before class so that you are well-positioned to contribute to the tutorial discussions and activities. Insights from the tutorials will be essential for all three assessments.
