	Program Description & syllabus		<p>This class uses both Japanese and English language for communication. Those who register to this class are expected to have at least B2 level (CEFR) of English proficiency level, so that they are able to follow the lecture conducted in English.</p> <p>Global Citizenship is the knowledge of nations, cultures, or societies beyond one's own country. The recognition of how interaction, interdependence, and inequity among diverse geographical, social, political, or economic systems have shaped historical and contemporary global challenges and opportunities; and the skills to engage with the responsibilities of informed citizenship in a complex, interdependent, and changing world.</p> <p>This class consists of a series of lectures and a COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning) experience, in which students will communicate with the students overseas through PBL (project-based learning). The class expects the students to be active participants who take an initiative on their own learning. Some of the universities which this class may be collaborating with in the COIL component are located in the United States, Australia, India, Spain, Ghana, Jordan, and Chile.</p> <p>This course may be taught via zoom depending on the situations in which the international students face under the COVID-19 impact.</p> <p>Each week tackles a particular angle or viewpoint we can use to look at the idea of global citizenship, and the challenges we face as a global community.</p> <p>Week 1-2 What does it mean to be a global citizen? What connections to the global community do you see around you on a daily basis? Week 3-6 Cultural and political global issues and challenges Equality and Difference: how should we approach global challenges?
