	<b>Program Description &amp; syllabus</b>		The G-DORM online program, which is a collaborative online international learning (COIL), is a student exchange program conducted by Niigata University in collaboration with universities in Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, and Vietnam. In the program, participating students will form cross-academic year, cross-disciplinary, and multinational student teams, which are the characteristics of "dormitory-type education," and conduct market group-work (GW) internships with project-based learning online. "Market internship" is a market research-based internship in which students learn through research and study of the characteristics and trends of the markets and societies that are the aim of companies. In market GW internships, students work to understand the connections among corporate activity, science and technology, and international society from an integrative perspective through group work with companies in Japan or the above-mentioned countries. The learners of this course will be from Royal University of Phnom Penh (Cambodia), National University of Laos (Laos), Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), Hanoi University of Science and Technology (Vietnam), and Niigata University (Japan) in addition to students from UMAP member universities. Learning through this course is related to SDGs especially SDGs 17.
