In this omnibus course, each week a different professor in the Innovative Global Program introduces some aspects of their native country and culture as hints for living and working in their culture. Students can begin to understand and respect the culture, style of communication, and expectations in social behavior and workplace communication in 14 different cultures. • Purpose of class: This course is designed to prepare students to work in international teams as students, laboratory researchers, and engineers in their future careers.
