Application fee Tuition	Students studying at Toyo through partner university exchanges, UMAP Program A, and ISEP Exchange do not need to pay application fees or tuition.																
Important considerations	<p><b>Support system</b> - If you need special support or accommodations because of any sort of disability (learning or otherwise), please consult with us early in the application process. A letter from your physician and an accommodation letter from your home university will be required. We will contact you to confirm your situation and determine what kind of support we can provide. We will do our best to accommodate the request. However, please understand that depending on the situation we may not be able to</p>																

fulfill all requests.

**Affiliated faculty** - During your study abroad program, you will be assigned to a faculty at Toyo that may not necessarily match the faculty/department of your home university. The faculty with which you are affiliated has no bearing on the courses you take while at Toyo.

**Academic level** - Graduate students who participate in the study abroad program at Toyo are regarded as undergraduate students; however, graduate students who satisfy certain conditions may take some graduate level coursework.

**Change of period of study** – **After you have submitted your online application, it is not possible to change your period of study (from one semester to one year, or from one year to one semester).**

**Course list** – Not all Toyo courses are available for study abroad students. Study abroad students choose courses from the list of courses for study abroad students at Toyo. The course list will be available about one month before the semester starts.

**After the exchange program** – Under the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act, you are required to return to your home country once your period of study has ended, even if you still have time remaining on your “Student” status of residence. Regardless of the remaining validity of your status of residence, you are expected to return to your home country within approximately two weeks after the completion of your exchange program at Toyo University. Please note that you are not permitted to stay in Japan with the “Student” status of residence once your exchange period has concluded.

## Classes

Academic calendar (provisional)

The academic year of Toyo University is divided into two semesters (spring semester and autumn semester) and four quarters (1<sup>st</sup> quarter – 4<sup>th</sup> quarter).

Life in Japan	
Meals	<p>Campus cafeteria: Meals are available for about 580 JPY. The cafeteria is open 10:00 am to 8:00 pm, Monday through Saturday except during the university's long vacation periods and holidays.</p> <p>There are many supermarkets, convenience stores, and restaurants around Hakusan Campus.</p>
Health Insurance	<p>Study abroad students are required by Japanese law to enroll in Japanese National Health Insurance (NHI). The insurance fee is approximately 1,900 JPY per month. With Japanese National Health Insurance, students only have to pay 30% of the medical costs when they go to see doctors. More details about the insurance are provided during orientation sessions to be held upon your arrival. You will apply for NHI during orientation. In addition, we strongly recommend you to make arrangements for voluntary travel insurance in your home country that covers emergencies.</p>
Student ID	Toyo University issues study abroad students a student ID card, which is used to

card	access Toyo University's libraries and PC rooms. This card also allows students to obtain discounts for travel fares, museum entrance fees, theater fees, etc.
Bank account	Staff at International Affairs Office can support study abroad students who work at Toyo University as part time workers for opening their bank account with a Japanese bank after they arrive in Japan.
Credit card	Please bring a credit card which can be used in Japan.
Part-time work	As a study abroad student, it is possible to get a part-time job and work up to 28 hours per week. To do so, you must acquire Permission to Engage in Activity Other than that Permitted under the Status of Residence Previously Granted. You may get this Permission <b>at the airport immigration counter</b> or by going to the Regional Immigration Bureau.  <b>*The income of a part-time job is not enough to cover all the rent, food and other expenses while studying abroad. Make sure you have other ways to cover the expenses of studying abroad.</b>

Beyond that, you should budget approximately 30,000 JPY for meals.</p> <p>National Health Insurance fees (1,900 JPY~)</p> <p>SIM card or phone bill (20,000JPY/6 months)</p> <p>Other such as transportation fee (10,000JPY~)</p> <p>*If you include commuter pass, you will need more than 15,000JPY~</p> <p>【For semester】</p> <p>Textbooks and reference books (20,000 JPY~)</p> <p>Since Japan is still primarily a cash-based society, there are many cases where credit cards are not accepted. <u>Study abroad students are recommended to have at least 150,000 to 200,000 JPY in cash for their first two months.</u></p>

Visa Procedure
<p>Study abroad students are required to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) and a visa for entering Japan.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• [Certificate of Eligibility] An email about the application for Certificate of Eligibility (COE) will be sent to the address you provided at the time of application from PUGS (Toyo University's COE Application System) via <a href="mailto:noreply-pugs@tugs.co.jp">noreply-pugs@tugs.co.jp</a> After you submit your completed application for COE through PUGS, the Toyo University Support Office for COE and Status of Residence (TUGS Office) will apply for your COE to the relevant immigration bureau. Once the COE has been issued, they will upload it to PUGS.</li> </ul> <p>Please note that the COE application screening process usually takes 2 to 3 months. Once you receive</p>

the email, please follow the instructions and complete the required procedures as soon as possible.

Certificate of Eligibility (COE)	<p>You need to present your COE when you apply for a visa at a Japanese diplomatic office in your country. The COE becomes invalid unless you apply for landing (entry into Japan) within three months of its issuance.</p> <p>* The Certificate of Eligibility verifies, at the time of landing screening, that the activity in which a foreigner wishes to engage in Japan is not false and that the activity matches landing qualifications such as being an activity stipulated by a relevant status of residence under the immigration law (except the status of residence for short-time [three months] visitors). This document is issued by a regional immigration bureau under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Justice to foreign nationals in advance of their arrival in Japan.</p>
Financial Supporting Documents	<p>In order to obtain the COE, you are required to submit proof (in the form of bank statements, certificates of scholarships, etc.) that you can support yourself financially with the equivalent of 150,000 JPY per month for your study period.</p>
Visa	<p>A visa is issued at a Japanese diplomatic office in your country. You are expected to enter Japan within three months of the issuance of the visa. The visa you will obtain is valid either for one year or 6 months, allowing you to enter Japan multiple times during your stay.</p> <p>* A visa signifies the judgment that a foreigner wishing to enter Japan has been deemed suitable to enter and stay in Japan. Please be aware that a visa does not guarantee the permission of entry (stay), but is deemed as one of the requirements for landing application at the port of entry (airport/seaport). As in many countries, Japan has a system in which a foreigner wishing to enter Japan is required to have permission from immigration offices, i.e. the said Certificate of Eligibility, in addition to a visa.</p>
Immigration Inspection (Entry Procedures)	<p>Immigration inspection is the process that foreign travellers must complete in order to be legally admitted into Japan upon arrival. The following is an overview of the procedure and the documents you will need.</p> <p><b>Required Documents:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>· A valid passport with your Student Visa (visa sticker)</li><li>· Certificate of Eligibility (COE): please print it out in advance and bring it with you</li><li>· Embarkation/Disembarkation Card for Foreigners (ED Card): distributed on the airplane; not required if you have completed registration through “Visit Japan Web” beforehand</li></ul> <p><b>Procedures at the Immigration Inspection Area:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>· Present your passport and required documents</li><li>· Undergo fingerprinting and facial photograph</li><li>· Answer simple questions from the immigration officer regarding the purpose of your stay and your accommodation in Japan</li></ul> <p><b>Issuance of the Residence Card:</b></p> <p>At immigration inspection, an “Landing Permission” sticker will be placed in your passport, and your Residence Card will be issued on the spot. Once you have</p>

secured your place of residence in Japan, you must take your Residence Card to the local municipal office and complete your resident registration **within 14 days**.  
※Students planning to engage in part-time work or a paid internship during the period of study in Japan must complete the application procedures for “Permission to Engage in Activity Other Than That Permitted Under the Status of Residence Previously Granted” at the time of immigration inspection. The application form is available at the airport.

- Two photos (size: 45 x 45 mm, taken within six months of the date of visa application.)
- Certificate of Eligibility
- Letter of Acceptance issued by Toyo University (photocopy)
