Overview of Program for Enhancing Employment of International Students

Toyo University is the selected for the "Career Development Program for Foreign Students in Japan" by the Government of Japan (the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology) as a university which actively supports international students to find employment in Japan.

Students can learn business Japanese at Toyo University

Having business Japanese language skills is the most important factor for Japanese companies when they hire international students. At Toyo University, students can acquire not only academic Japanese skills but also high-level business Japanese proficiency.

Students can participate in Japanese internships at Toyo University.

Toyo University has a unique program which provides a wide variety of opportunities for international students to participate in internships in Tokyo, as well as attractive regional cities (including in Gunma, Ibaraki, Nara, Wakayama, Ishikawa, Toyama, Okayama, Shimane and Oita prefectures). This program allows international students to engage in social activities while in school. Also, based on their working experience, they can expand their employment opportunities.

Students can aim for employment in Japan at Toyo University

As the University closely collaborates with other universities in regional cities, our students can learn regional cultures and Japanese cultural diversity, and they can utilize such knowledge in finding employment in Japan while learning in Tokyo, the center of Japan.




(Diagram) (For Students of Toyo University) Job Hunting Road Map for Students Aiming for Employment in Japan

BJT Business Japanese Proficiency Test

The BJT (Business Japanese Proficiency Test) is a test to measure your proficiency in communicating in the Japanese language in business settings.

At the time of job hunting for employment at Japanese companies, you can use the test score to demonstrate that you have Japanese language skills that can be used in business settings.

You can indicate your BJT score as proof of your Japanese language proficiency on the Application for Certificate of Eligibility.(Score of 300 points or higher is equivalent to N5 of the IIPT)

The test has been certified as the major requirements for "Designated Activities" regarding employment support for international students (Graduates of a university in Japan). (Score of 480 points or higher is equivalent to N1 of the JLPT.)

In the Points-based Preferential Immigration Treatment for Highly Skilled Foreign Professionals, you are eligible for 15 points (equivalent to N1 of the JLPT) if you have a score of 480 points or higher in the BJT and 10 points (equivalent to N2 of the JLPT) if you have a score of 400 points or higher.

Annual implementation schedule

1 st test : July

2nd test : December

Test fee subsidization

The University subsidizes half of the test fee.

(Regular class)




Guidance for career development starting from the 1st year and establishment of a comprehensive support system


